## FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

### Growing Together

As we have begun a new year, we are seeking to take seriously the various encouragements from the Book of Romans and other studies. We are grateful at the response to the 3 new Men's Bible Studies, the increased attendance for Wednesday night studies, and many others. *Hunger for God's Word is exactly what we all need.* Indeed, there's nothing that will build fellowship and character more than availing ourselves to God's means of grace on a regular basis. Our church attendance for January has been very encouraging, and we have just adopted some strong plans for the coming year.

I believe that God is calling us together and to unite more and more around his Word. In a few weeks, you'll have an opportunity to hear an excellent leader, Dr. Michael Milton (Feb. 11-12) who will preach for our Missions Conference. Information about Dr. Milton, his topics, and the schedule is posted and in the bulletin. Do plan to join us for that missions emphasis.

And another outstanding opportunity to grow will be our Spring Enrichment Conference, led by Dr. Guy Richardson (Wes Richardson's brother, although Guy will deny any relation), March 16-18. Dr. Richardson, the President of Reformed Theological Seminary (Jackson), will be bringing us important messages and teaching on Marriage and Family Enrichment. Please put those dates in your calendar and we'll release more details soon.

Along with the numerous other opportunities to hear God's Word and serve together, I wanted you to be aware of some of these upcoming special services.

I am also happy to commend two other short articles below.

A PCA pastor in North Carolina (who formerly worked at Smyrna PCA), has posted a fine, short article on the importance of the church and membership on his blog. I think all members and friends would benefit from a review of why we think this is so important.

### Church Membership by the Rev. Andy Jones

The only letters Jesus Christ ever wrote were to churches. (Revelation 1-3). He could have easily written letters to individual Christians. But he didn't. Rather, he wrote letters to seven churches. The local gathering of Christians each week is not a human invention. Jesus looks down from heaven and recognizes these gatherings as his church. He did not write a letter to the Christians in Ephesus. He wrote a letter to the church in Ephesus. We often think of the church as a human organization devoted to a divine person. The Bible speaks of it as a divine organization, the place where heaven and earth intersect.

Sadly, the lowest view of the local, organized, and visible church is often found among Christians. For many, church membership is seen as an unnecessary step for the Christian experience. In their minds, you can be healthy without joining a gym and you can be a Christian without joining a church. Membership vows have become like marriage vows, treated as an afterthought. Here's five quick observations from the New Testament that relay the importance of church membership:

**First**, from the day the church of Jesus Christ started, the apostles kept an account of who professed faith and was baptized. Three thousand were saved through work of the Spirit and the word at Pentecost. Since Luke provides us with this number, it seems the leaders kept up with the sheep who were being gathered. The purpose wasn't statistical. Rather, it shows these people were known by the apostles.

**Second**, the New Testament envisioned every Christian being under the care of overseers, often called elders. The Holy Spirit provides elders to "care for the church of God" (Acts 20:28). There is no place in Paul's understanding for a church-less Christian. To be under the care of the Good Shepherd is to be part of his flock.

**Third**, the New Testament church was an organized institution. They had established places and time to meet. They collected and distributed money. They elected leaders. They received mail and read it aloud.

They even had administrative paperwork to keep up with who needed benevolence (1 Timothy 4:9-11). The only way you could receive instruction and care was to be connected to these formally recognized gathering of believers.

**Fourth**, the New Testaments writers assume that every Christian knows who their elder is. There are numerous exhortations in the Scriptures that are impossible to keep unless you actually know who your elder is. For example, Hebrews 13:17 states, “Obey your leaders and submit to them.” If you are a professing Christian who is not formally connected to a local body of believers, how do you obey this command? You cannot obey and submit to a televangelist, radio program, or podcast. You can only obey and submit to people you know and who know you.

**Fifth**, the primary image of the church as a body assumes an actual point of connection. The New Testament writers described the church as a body of which Jesus is the head. You cannot receive the life-giving resources of the body without being tangibly connected to it.

Is it possible to be a Christian without being a church member? Yes, in exceptional situations (see the thief on the cross). The book of Acts shows that once Christ ascended and the Spirit was poured out, churches were established and multiplied. The spread of the gospel was one and the same as the spread of the church. Apostles established churches wherever they went. Christians formally connected themselves to these institutions where they received oversight.

We live in a culture committed to permanently casual relationships. We have loose relationships with our spouses, workplaces, and neighborhoods. A counter-cultural tendency appears in the New Testament as Christians formally aligned themselves together into congregations. Christians often speak of the institutional church with embarrassment, sometimes understandably (“we don’t do church”). However, it is the church that Jesus bought with his own blood. It is the church that he promised to protect and bless. He is not ashamed identify himself with the church and we ought not to be ashamed either.

### **From the Cutting Floor**

PCA church planter in Pooler, Georgia, the Rev. Nick Batzig wrote a wonderful devotional that was published in December’s *TableTalk*. It may encourage many.

#### **“Take Heed (December 2011 *Tabletalk* Article)**

Bernard of Clairvaux once mentioned an old man who—upon hearing about any professing Christian who fell into sin—would say to himself, “He fell today; I may fall tomorrow.” The apostle Paul commended the same mindset when he wrote, “let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall” (1 Corinthians 10:12). There is great wisdom in not trusting our own ability to stand. When I was a boy my father would often say, “The person I trust least of all is myself.” It should shock us to hear a professing Christian say, “I would never do that,” or “How could anyone do that?” The Scriptures record great sins of unbelievers and believers alike to

instruct us in diverse ways. The former teach the unregenerate their need for the new birth. The latter teach the saints their need to distrust themselves. It is one thing to understand the sinful actions of unbelievers in Scripture; it is quite another to understand the sins of the saints. Consider the following:

If an innocent man could choose a piece of fruit over the infinitely valuable God (Genesis 3:6); If the most righteous man of his day could get so drunk that he passed out naked before his sons in his tent (Gen. 9:21); If the most faithful man of his day could father a child with his wife’s handmaiden (Gen. 16:1-4); If he could hand his wife over to other men—twice! (Gen. 12:11-15; 20:1-2); If the mother of promise could laugh at the words of the God of promise—and then lie to Him about doing so—(Gen. 18:9-15); If “righteous Lot” could greedily pick the most materialistic and sexually depraved place for he and his family to live (Gen. 13:8-13); If he could hand his daughters over to the sexually perverse men of the city (Gen. 19:4-8); If the son of promise could show partiality to his oldest son because he liked his hunting skills (Gen. 25:28); If he too could hand his wife over to another man (Gen. 26:6-11); If the namesake of Israel could swindle his brother for a birthright (Gen. 25:29-34) . . . so could I.

If the meekest man on the planet could act in such sinful anger and unbelief that God would not let him into the promised Land (Numbers 20:7-12); If his successor could disobediently covenant with pagans (Joshua 9); If two of Israel’s greatest judges could, in unbelief, doubt the immediate promises of God (Judges 4; 11); If the mighty man of valor could fall into idolatry at the end of his life (Judges 8:22-27); If the strongest man who ever lived could be defeated by wine and women (Judges 14-16) . . . so could I.

If the man after God’s own heart could commit adultery and premeditated the murder of one of his mighty men (2 Samuel 11); If the wisest man could foolishly allow his heart to be led astray by a thousand women to worship foreign gods (1 Kings 11); If the weeping prophet could charge God with deceiving His people (Jeremiah 4:10); If his penman could seek fame for helping him write his book (45:5); If the most evangelistically used Old Testament prophet could self-righteously run from the mission of God (Jonah 1-3) . . . so could I.

If the forerunner of Christ could doubt the identity of the One to whom he bore witness (Matthew 11:2-3); If the apostle Peter could try to stop Jesus from going to the cross (Matt. 16:21-23) . . . could deny Jesus (Luke 22:54-61) . . . could argue with the Lord about the Gospel and its implications (John 13:6-10; Acts 10:9-16); and, could support a division in the church over the doctrine of justification by faith alone (Galatians 2:11-21); If James and John could use Jesus to get to the top (Mark 10:35-37); If they could want to call fire down from heaven on those who did not believe the Gospel (Luke 9:51-55); and If the apostle John could fall down to worship Angels—twice! (Revelation 19:9-10; 22:8-9) . . . so could I!

We must resist the temptation of thinking we can stand in our own strength. We must depend on the grace of the One who said, "Apart from Me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). If we fall, we must go to Christ—confessing our sin and hoping in His mercy. The Scriptures declare: "The righteous falls seven times and rises again" (Prov. 24:16). To fall seven times means that you have been restored six. The greatest believers are subject to great weaknesses. In no way do these truths give a license to sin; instead, they give a sober realization that "nothing good dwells in us." We must distrust ourselves, bear with the weak, and hold fast to Christ. We must flee to our great High Priest, who was tempted in all points as we are—yet without sin. We must go to Him for grace and mercy to withstand temptations; and we must go to Him for grace and mercy if we fall. Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses . . . "let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall."

There is pure joy in listening to Kevin as he describes the work and challenges in an area where the Gospel once flourished. Continue to pray for the work in Sheffield.

**Michael Cuneo** works with Mission to Italy and is a pastor planting a church in Viterbo, Italy (approx. 1 hour north of Rome). A small reformed congregation existed before his coming, but lacked a full-time pastor. Although they have seen some growth, the work is challenging in a post-Christian, secular country. Nevertheless their goal is to preach Christ, equip the saints, and plant future reformed congregations in Italy.

## **Midway Nursery Ministry News**

Living in the information age, parents are bombarded with child-care warnings from their doctors, parent magazines, TV talk shows, and newspapers. Frightening images from Dateline and 20/20 telling parents they are to interview each baby sitter and child-care provider thoroughly, make surprise visits, and ask for references. The result is fear and anxiety!

So what's a nursery filled with loving volunteers to do? We are going to crawl into the minds of an informed parent as they think about our Midway Nursery Ministry in these many areas:

**STAFFING:** Each area of our Nursery Ministry has a paid Supervisor to oversee the age appropriate areas we offer for our children from infant through 3 + (some have turned 4 and stay in the Nursery until promotion at the end of May). Our Supervisors are Midway Members, First Aid and CPR certified with a full background check. They serve all year round but they take turns every other month so they may attend church services and Sunday school on their months off. We make sure there is also an adult volunteer in every room that the Supervisor is monitoring. Even though the guidelines say one adult per three babies, we say one per two or one on one sometimes if the child needs a lap. Our Volunteer guidelines allow trained ten year olds and up to also help play with the Nursery children, but only fourteen year olds and up may be assisting in the infant (called the Lambs) rooms.

**ENVIRONMENT:** The toys are cute and are age appropriate in each room. We check the toys for defects, we disinfect the toys through a run in our dishwasher and we spray down the larger toys with food-safe disinfectant. Our Infant Supervisors are briefed on cloth diapers, nursing mothers and we take individual instructions well. We strive to be a well-baby area and discourage sick children from attending and all volunteers are encouraged to only come when they are also well.

**SECURITY:** We use the two part security tag system when each child is checked in. One part goes with the parent the other part is clipped on to the child or diaper bag if the child will be held the whole time. A taped name tag will be attached to that child. The child stays within the Nursery area and in the age appropriate room during their visit with us.

**SEPARATION ANXIETY:** To acclimate a child and parent to the comforts of the Nursery area, a parent may stay in their room with them for as long as they like to help their child feel comfortable. Once the parent is ready to leave, a pager is given to the parents so, if we have questions or need their help, we will buzz them to come down. If the parent leaves a crying child we will use our comfort techniques: distraction with a cute toy, read a book, or engage them with what the other children are doing. After checking the diaper, feeding a bottle - if a prepared one is left, ten minutes later and if they are still crying we will page the parents for other ideas to comfort their child. It will be the parents' choice to give us more tips (blanket, pacifier, or favorite toy), come in and stay with their child showing them they can enjoy their time here or they may choose to take the child with them.
